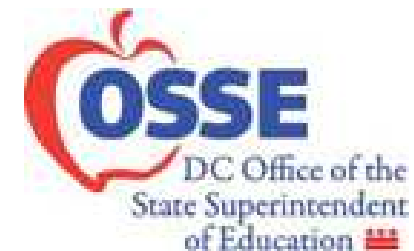
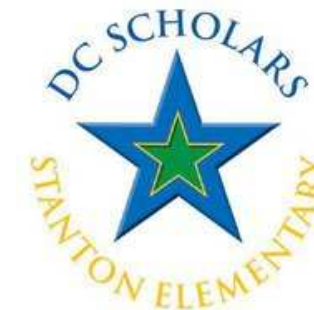

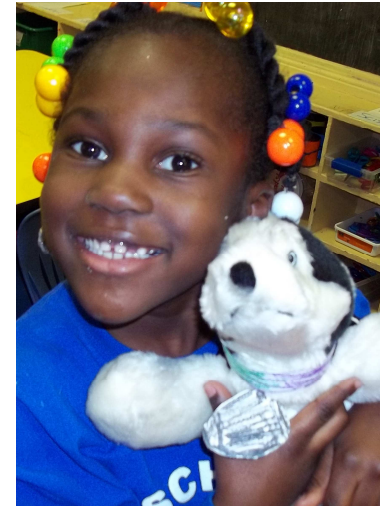

180 children are enrolled in PAL Club, with 125 coming daily

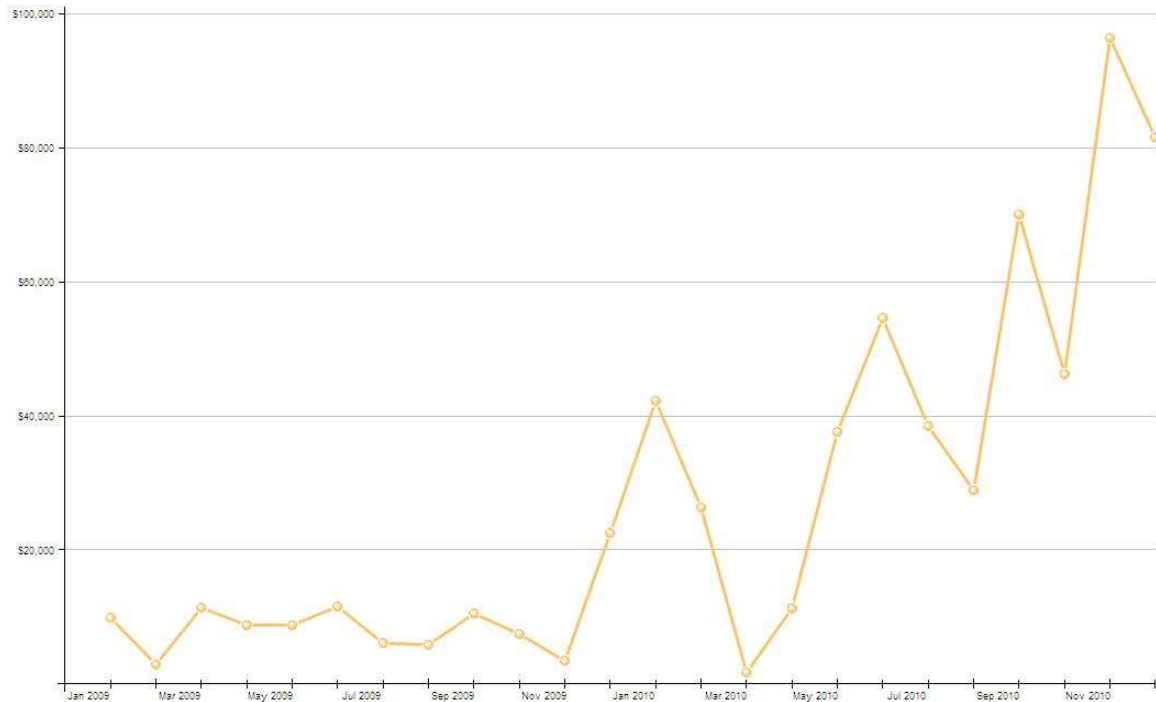
PAL Club expanded to include kindergarten students
