MESSAGE TO THE PARENTS

We are reinforcing the 6:15 dismissal policy. The PAL lessons are from 5:20-6:05 and when your child is called for early dismissal, it not only disrupts the lesson but your child misses out on participating in an exciting science lesson. They often make projects and a lot of them have gone unfinished because they are leaving before class is over. **If your child is picked up earlier than 6:15 a verbal, second, and final warning will be given** which will jeopardize your child's spot in our afterschool program. The policy will be waived only during inclement weather and emergencies. If there is an emergency please call the PAL phone so we can have your child ready for pick

up. Please adhere to the policy in place for dismissal and be sure to call in advance.

We would also like to remind you that PAL's After School Program is a voluntary program with limited space, and attendance is **MANDATORY**. Students are expected to attend PAL at least 90% of the time. This means students are only allowed **1 absence every two weeks**. Students who frequently miss more than this will be unenrolled from the program. Any child that misses 5 days of after school in a 2 month period without an excuse will be terminated from the program.
